- Paul mentioned again the "<u>hard work</u>" of the gospel ministry (2 Thess. 3:7-8).
- Paul stated the value and need to work (2 Thess. 3:10).
- Paul sought to correct the ungodly **behavior** of some in the church (2 Thess. 3:11-12).
- Paul called the church to stay focused and not grow weary (2 Thess. 3:13).
- Paul asked the church to <u>warn</u> other believers who refused to obey what the Spirit led Paul to write (2 Thess. 3:14-15).
