## Amos: The Call of God is Personal

God uses **people**! The Bible is filled with illustrations of God calling people to serve Him. Abraham's call was to leave everything; Moses' call was to deliver and lead God's people; Isaiah's call came in a time of amazing worship; James and John's call came in the workplace; Paul's call revealed the need and power of God's grace; and Amos' call showed how God uses ordinary people. Amos announced his call by saying, "Then Amos answered and said to Amaziah, "I was no prophet, nor a prophet's son, but I was a herdsman and a dresser of sycamore figs. But the Lord took me from following the flock, and the Lord said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel" (Amos 7:14-15).

God isn't just calling the <u>educated</u> and the <u>affluent</u>. He invites the common and ordinary to hear His voice and follow Him. What's necessary in reference to God's call?

"Amos is unusual among the <u>writing prophets</u> because his messages focused almost exclusively on condemnation. God knew His man! Amos was blunt, plainspoken, and unintimidated by 'important' people with impressive titles. He spoke fearlessly against the materialism, injustices, and idolatry that characterized the Samaria of his day. Yet Amos did not ignore God's covenant promises to Israel."

"Prophets did not speak only to warn, chastise, or announce judgment. They also spoke God's Word "for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, and for instruction in righteousness (2 Tim. 3:16). In other words, their purpose was also to teach so that God's people would know how-to live-in times of crisis and times of calm."

God talked with Amos about a "plumb line." In Amos 7:7-9, the Bible says, "This is what he showed me: behold, the Lord was standing beside a wall built with a plumb line, with a plumb line in his hand. And the Lord said to me, "Amos, what do you see?" And I said, "A plumb line." Then the Lord said, 'Behold, I am setting a plumb line in the midst of my people Israel; I will never again pass by them; the high places of Isaac shall be made desolate, and the sanctuaries of Israel shall be laid waste, and I will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword."

"A plumb line is a <u>builder's tool</u> for determining that a surface is straight. All sin and resulting judgment are measured against the holiness and righteousness of the Lord." In Amos 5:21-24, the Bible says, "I hate, I despise your feasts, and I take no delight in your solemn assemblies. Even though you offer me your burnt offerings and grain offerings, I will not accept them; and the peace offerings of your fattened animals, I will not look upon them. Take away from me the noise of your songs; to the melody of your harps I will not listen. But let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream." Are our <u>fellowship</u> gatherings, <u>worship</u> services, and <u>personal</u> offerings pleasing to God?

How does God <u>speak</u> in our day? He uses the Bible, prayer, the Holy Spirit, circumstances, and people. As we live life, what is God saying to us? In the book of Amos, God pronounced seven disasters to get His people's attention.
