What is a **proverb**?

- It is a "a short popular saying, usually of unknown and ancient origin, that expresses effectively some commonplace truth or useful thought."
- "Proverbs generally operate on the principle that consequences follow acts: you reap what you sow."
- "A proverb is a short, concise sentence that conveys moral truth."

- Authored thousands of **proverbs** and **songs**
- Noted for **faults** and **greatness**

What is the difference between knowledge and wisdom?

Knowledge is "**knowing** the facts." Wisdom is "**applying** those facts to life."

The book of Proverbs seeks to give wisdom to **young people** (1:1-9:18), **all people** (10:1-24:34), and **leaders** (25:1-31:31).

Proverbs 1:7 – *The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction.*

What does it mean to "<u>fear the Lord</u>?" It's an entire life in love, reverence, worship, and obedience to God.

1. God refuses to play **hide-and-seek** with His people.

Proverbs 3:5-6 – Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

2. God disciplines His children.

Proverbs 3:11-12 – My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline or be weary of his

reproof, for the Lord reproves him whom he loves, as a father the son in whom he delights.

3. God calls His people to be **<u>quick</u>** to listen and **<u>slow</u>** to speak.
